Please ensure that children have a change of clothes and wellies.

<u>PLEASE</u> write your child's name inside <u>all</u> their clothing, shoes and bags - it makes it easier to return it to the right person!

How can I help with my child's learning?

Share and enjoy a book with your child (daily).

Recognise print in the environment – can they find any of the letters of their name on labels of food packets, street names?

Help your child to use the toilet and manage their own personal hygiene.

Put on their own socks, shoes and coat.

Play board games at home to help with counting and turn taking skills.

Recognise the numbers 1 - 10.

Mark making with lots of different media: water, chalk, crayons, paint.

Hold a pencil by the point.

Copy familiar letters - first letter (or more!) of their name.

If you make the time each day to do these things with your child, it will make a significant difference to your child's confidence as a young learner.
