<u>Science</u>

Identify, name, draw and label the basic parts of the human body and say which part of the body is associated with each sense

<u>P.E.</u>

P.E. will take place every **Monday** and **Wednesday** and both sessions will be outdoors. P.E. kit will be worn all day. Please allow children to wear trainers during the cold weather.

<u>PSHE</u>

Our main focus for Spring 1 will be to ensure that all children are happy, healthy and feel safe at school. We will be focussing on feelings and emotions; healthy relationships this term.



<u>RE</u>

We will be learning about the Christian Bible this term. Each week we'll be reading a story from the Bible and discuss the meaning of the stories.

<u>History</u>
