HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

Welcome back to another exciting school year at Morden Primary! We hope you had an enjoyable summer break. We would like to warmly welcome our new children and new families to Morden Primary. Our school community thrives on collaboration, and we believe that when families and school work together, children can achieve their personal best. Children at Morden are very lucky as our hardworking staff offer exceptional pastoral care.

We certainly had an unexpected visit from Mother Nature on Wednesday when the school rear playground was flooded within the short 10 minute burst of rain – typically just as the children were due to go home. Thank you for your patience whilst we made last-minute changes to get all children safely out the building. A one-stop shop for key curriculum information you will need across the year.


Tuesday 10th September 2024, 5:00 — 7:00pm







