A friendly reminder of our Nursery session times:

Morning session: 8:30 AM - 11:30 AM
Afternoon session: 12:30 PM - 3:30 PM

Please ensure your child arrives **on time**, as the first part of each session includes an important **carpet time**, where children gather to learn about the day's activities. This helps with their settling-in process and ensures they start the day together.

Morning gate closes at 8.40m.

If your child arrives late, please bring them directly to the school office. You will need to wait with your child until a member of staff is available to take your child to Nursery. Please note that the office is very busy and you may have to wait a while before someone becomes available.

We ask that you are not only mindful of ensuring your child's wellbeing by arriving on time, but also of the other children and staff.

MESSAGES TO THE OFFICE

Often there is only one admin staff member in the office after lunchtime. *After 3pm, any messages cannot be guaranteed to be with the class teacher before 3.10pm.*
