#### **HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE:**

It's been a busy week for the start of our last half term. We received our Ofsted report this week and this has been shared with parents today. I am proud of each and every child and staff member in this school who work so hard to achieve the best for everyone. Even though it was an ungraded inspection (this means that when they come in, they are inspecting that the school remains at least the same as its previous grade), comments from the Inspector during leadership feedback indicated a lot of aspects of the school are outstanding, or very close to. In fact, one of the Inspectors asked if it would be possible, once the report has been published, to organise for some staff members to come and look at our Early Years Provision © On a personal note, as both a Headteacher and a mother of 3, the most important thing about a primary school is the *pastoral care and the* relationships that are nurtured. Therefore I am extremely proud that in consecutive **inspections**, this has been highlighted and celebrated. In our last inspection it was reported as "exceptional pastoral care" and you will see in this report, amongst other positive comments, it says "high levels of pastoral support are at the heart of the school community." (which you will see as new tag lines on our Morden Messenger) It is my expectation that this doesn't just happen within our school building and walls, but that parents also display this care to each other as well. 




